

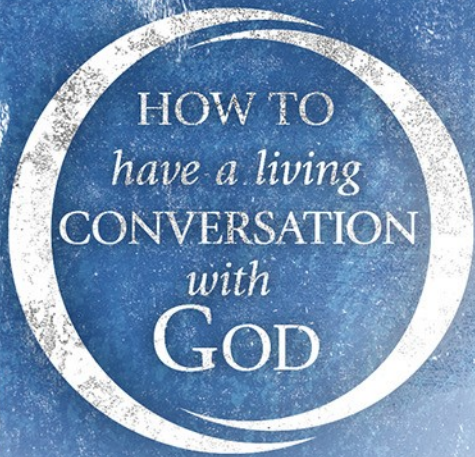

MONDAY	Genesis 2:25, 3:6-10, 3:16-19, 3:21 ~ Sin
TUESDAY	Genesis 22:1-14 ~ Isaac Foreshadows Christ
WEDNESDAY	Exodus 11:1-12:12 ~ The First Born
THURSDAY	Hebrews 9:22, 10:11-14 ~ The Blood of Jesus
FRIDAY	Isaiah 42:1-9 ~ The Servant of the Lord
SATURDAY	Isaiah 7:10-14, Matthew 1:18-24 ~ The Sign

Consider these questions for each day you engage God in a Living Conversation:

- Day 1: Do you recognize the themes of sin, shame, and how God provides through the blood of another?
- Day 2: How does God use the story of Abraham and Isaac to foreshadow the work of Christ?
- Day 3: Do you recognize the themes of a substitute death to protect those that trusted in God's plan?
- Day 4: Why is only the sacrifice of Jesus capable of atoning for our sin, and no other sacrifice?
- Day 5: Ask God why it is important, and why He desires to foretell his plan before it comes about?
- Day 6: Why do you think God was upset with Ahaz for refusing to ask for a sign?

Steps to Having a Living Conversation with God

Step 1— Engaging the Truth

Start by inviting the Holy Spirit through prayer into your time in the Word. Acknowledge that you'll obey and ask him to guide you as you read. Read the verse three times through.

Step 2 - Exploring the Truth

After reading the passage consider: What is the main point of the passage? What do you like about the passage and why? Do you have a question about something? How could you explain the passage to a first grader? (This is a good way to make sure you've got it.)

Step 3 - Applying the Truth

This is where the rubber meets the road. Take a minute or two and be quiet and reflect on the passage and the discussion, asking God, "How am I to respond to all of this? What am I to do?" As we reflect, often God gives insight in one of three ways. He may remind us of:

1. A truth that we're to embrace about him or his ways or what he thinks of us.
2. Something to do or to stop doing.
3. Someone to love, to reach out to, or to forgive.

Step 4 - Prayer of Commitment

Commit to God in prayer to follow through on the direction he gave you. Obedience is his love language—let him know you love him!
